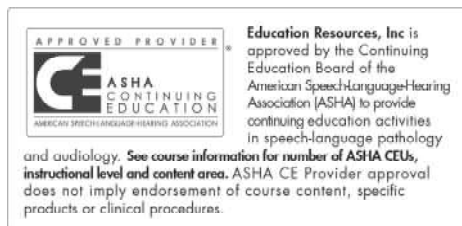

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COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for experienced pediatric physical, occupational, and speech therapists who are interested in improving their problem-solving skills in order to achieve more efficient functional outcomes for children with Neuromuscular Disorders such as Cerebral Palsy and Down Syndrome. Emphasizing a NDT (NeuroDevelopmental Treatment) framework, the course will utilize client videos as a basis for problem solving sessions and handling labs. Therapists will have the opportunity to develop functional outcomes related to participation, analyze multi-system and single system impairments and discuss treatment plans. Labs will focus on handling strategies that address priority impairments, facilitate optimal control of posture and movement and relate directly to the desired functional outcomes. Carryover strategies for home, school and community will also be discussed.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this course participants will be able to:

1. Apply the ICF (International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health) model in assessment and treatment planning for children with Neuromotor disorders.
2. Hypothesize priority multi-system and single system impairments related to specific functional outcomes in children with Neuromuscular disorders.
3. Implement handling strategies practiced during the course to achieve functional outcomes with improved control of posture and movement in clients.

This Intermediate to Advanced course is for Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapists working with children of all ages who have Neuromuscular Disorders. Prior introduction in NDT concepts is strongly recommended.
